This esprit de corps is in the best tradition of the clans and we are happy to be able to assist them in their efforts with \$500.00 grants toward their instruction expenses.

We have continued the Charles O. Gordon Grade 4 Junior Piper of the Day Award at Grandfather Mountain and this will be an annual award. He was able to use his scholarship money for travel to various competitions and other piping expenses. This year's trophy was a jade acrylic spire engraved with the same logo as last year's obelisk.

Since we have the one standing scholarship at Grandfather we will be limiting our offer to two recipients each year at this time. If we are fortunate enough to grow the membership and receive more donations toward this worthy program we will reassess that number in the future. The scholarship is awarded based on the need and commitment of the applicant toward their art.
